<u>Word Study – Ephesians 2: 10</u>	
Two ideas in one verse; and two other references in the NT ποίημα (poiéma) Workmanship Ephesians 2: 10 and Romans 1:20	
προετοιμάζω (proetoimazó) Prepared beforehand Ephesians 2: 10 and Romans 9:23	
For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand so that we would walk in them. Ephesians 2:10 The Greek reads "For of Him we are a product"	
For since the creation of the world His invisible <i>attributes, that is,</i> His eternal power and divine nature, have been clearly perceived, being understood by what has been made, so that they are without excuse. Romans 1:20	
And He did so to make known the riches of His glory upon objects of mercy, which He prepared beforehand for glory, namely us, whom He also called, not only from among Jews, but also from among Gentiles. Romans 9: 23	
 Poiema from poieo = to make with the suffix -ma = the result of work Means something that is composed, constructed, made, manufactured, a product, a design produced by an artisan, a work of art, something artfully created. In the Septuagint (Greek translation of the OT) poiema refers to God's work in creation. 	
Proetoimázō from /pró, "beforehand" and /hétoimos, "ready because prepared" – properly, made ready in advance; hence, "ready, already prepared".
